The Montana Department of Transportation (MDT) Aeronautics Division is thrilled to announce that its highly anticipated annual Teacher Workshop is scheduled for October 13th and 14th at Canyon Ferry Lake. In collaboration with the esteemed Montana Learning Center (MLC), the Division is excited to offer this immersive program that is authorized to provide 20 renewal credits through the Office of Public Instruction (OPI).

This year, the workshop will be led by a distinguished group of instructors, including Dr. Walter Wollbaugh from Montana State University (MSU); Ryan Hannahoe, the Executive Director of MLC; Chris Gillette, a retired airline pilot and member of the MLC team; and Matt Lindberg the Safety and Education Bureau Chief of the MDT Aeronautics Division.

Participants can expect to explore a wide range of aeronautics subjects, with theory-based lessons, demonstrations, and hands-on experiments that can be easily and affordably replicated in the classroom. The main objective of these lessons is to inspire a passion for aviation in students while imparting essential STEM (Science, technology, engineering, and math) principles that are applicable to their daily lives. The workshop promises a comprehensive experience, starting with introductory flights and exclusive tours of aviation facilities. Participants will have the opportunity to visit the Montana Air National Guard, an air ambulance operator, Helena College-Aircraft Mechanic School, and the Helena Air Traffic Control Tower. On the second day, the focus will shift to interactive classroom activities and studies at the MLC.



Due to the overwhelming interest in this program, interested teachers are strongly encouraged to submit their applications as early as possible to secure a spot. There is a registration fee of \$75, which will be fully refunded to participants who successfully complete the program.

The MDT Aeronautics Division awarded four grants for the Courtesy Car Program in June to the Geraldine, Stevensville, Ronan and Roundup Airports. The application for up to four reimbursable grants of up to \$5,000 was available on our website from April 1 to May 31, 2023 and received six applications.

If any of those airports are unable to use their award, another applicant will be considered so that the grants may all be used to assist the aviation community with local transportation when visiting airports across Montana.

The next application period the courtesy car grant will be open to airports interested in applying April 1 to - May 31, 2024.

Selling Your Airplane?

If you sell your aircraft, be sure to keep a copy of the Federal Aviation Administration's (FAA) Bill of Sale. The MDT Aeronautics Division requires a copy of the FAA Bill of Sale to cancel your state aircraft registration. A copy of the FAA Bill of Sale must accompany your signed affidavit, found on the bottom portion of your annual renewal invoice (a copy of your annual

invoice is mailed to you twice annually prior to the registration deadline as a courtesy). Your signed affidavit and FAA Bill of Sale must be received by the annual renewal deadline of March 1st each year. Please remember that registration fees plus late fees also apply for paperwork not received or incomplete paperwork submitted by the March 1st due date, even if you no longer own the aircraft. It is also a good idea to retain an additional copy of the FAA Bill of Sale for your own records.


