Dominique Prinnet to Speak at Montana Aviation Conference

In the 1960s, Dominique Prinnet was a commercial bush pilot in the Canadian Arctic, flying on floats in the summer and skis in the winter. Dominique's book, "Flying to Extremes", describes some of his adventures. He holds an Airline Transport Pilot (ATP) license.

Dominique has an engineering degree from University of British Columbia and an Masters in Business Administration from McGill University. Dominique worked as vice president for the airline Nordair in Montreal, while also teaching economics at McGill University. Dominique later became vice president of marketing at Canadian Pacific Airlines in Vancouver, British Columbia. He then went to Tanzania to manage the country's national airline, Air Tanzania, for five years.

Dominique is an expert sextant navigator, airplane and helicopter pilot, and has flown and trekked to many corners of the world. Dominique will be the Montana Aviation Conference keynote speaker during the closing banquet dinner on March 2.

63rd Annual Montana Airport Directory Released

The MDT Aeronautics Division is proud to present you with the 63rd annual Montana Airport Directory. The aviation community of Montana has again provided the cover photo for this year's directory by way of a photo contest. We asked our Montana and the Sky newsletter readers for cover photo submissions, and posted the photos received on MDT's Facebook page where followers voted for their favorite image.

This year, the winning photo was submitted by Daniel O'Loughlin. Daniel grew up in Billings and earned his private pilot's license in 2020. Taken from his recently completed kit-built Quad City Challenger II, the photo shows the Yellowstone River westbound from the Laurel Airport (6S8).

Many streams and rivers of Montana are excellent navigation aids such as the Yellowstone, Missouri, Clark Fork, Bitterroot, and Flathead, among others. Near the Laurentian and Continental Divides, our waterways separate at Triple Divide Peak in Glacier National Park, eventually flowing into the Gulf of Mexico, Pacific Ocean, or Hudson Bay. As shown in Daniel's photo, these waterways are still giving us a path to follow, even from the air. Whether you are following a river as Daniel followed the Yellowstone, steering by mountain peak, following an airway, or using the great magenta line of the GPS, Montana's skies never fail to offer an extraordinary flying experience. We enjoyed reviewing all the photo submissions and our thanks goes out to everyone who submitted. It is always enjoyable for us to see and hear of your aviation experiences in Montana, and we encourage you to reach out with stories and pictures.

Stevensville Locals Create New Scholarship

The Stevensville Airport Foundation (SAF) will be funding and awarding an aviation scholarship to a graduate of Stevensville High School in 2024.

The scholarship funds can be used for training/educational purposes in pursuit of a career as a pilot, aircraft mechanic, aeronautical engineer, air traffic controller, or a related aviation field. The scholarship will be formally known as the SAF/Paul O'Bagy Memorial Scholarship.

The SAF will be working closely with the school staff to identify and select potential candidates, and then make a final decision in early 2024.

The total value of the scholarship award is \$10,000. Two Stevensville donors have generously pledged to match contributions of the Two Stevensville donors also generously contributed to the scholarship pool. Any additional funds over the scholarship value will be utilized for a 2025 award.


