The purpose of the meeting was to discuss the outcome of the August Alcohol Leadership Summit of identifying the appropriate members for a Comprehensive Highway Safety Plan (CHSP) Executive Leadership Team and how they fit as a key to implementing safety strategies. Once the appropriate members are identified, Director Tooley will forward to the Governor's Office for approval a CHSP Executive Leadership Team that will represent and oversee the CHSPs three emphasis areas: Impaired Driving Crashes, Roadway Departure & Intersections Crashes, and Occupant Protection and overarching strategies. It is desirable to have this completed before the 2015 Annual Transportation Safety Meeting scheduled October 28 & 29. <http://www.mdt.mt.gov/visionzero/plans/chsp.shtml>
 Audrey Allums opened the meeting welcoming participants and provided an overview presentation on the CHSP update that includes ***Vision Zero – zero fatalities, zero serious injuries*** on Montana's

roadways; and an analysis of the past ten years of statewide crash data by the Advisory Committee in determining new focus areas where the best opportunity to reduce fatalities and serious injuries could be made. The emphasis areas were pared down from the original twelve to three areas of emphasis of which one is Impaired Driving Crashes. The overview explained the implementation framework and the roles and responsibilities of the three tiers that included the Executive Leadership Team. The Executive Leadership Team is envisioned as agency executives at the highest levels whose role and responsibility would include:

- *Prioritize and institutionalize safety, Vision Zero, across agencies*
- *Commit revenue, personnel and technical resources to implement statewide safety initiatives to reduce fatalities and serious injuries;*
- *Identify & remove barriers within and between agencies to achieve Vision Zero strategies*
- *Incorporate common safety strategies and initiatives into multi-agency plans and policies*
- *Provide leadership and collaboration addressing statewide safety issues and needs*
- *Delegate appropriate staff to participate actively in the emphasis areas to implement safety strategies.*

Vicki Turner noted that the ICC is in statute and that this leadership team and implementation might be considered for expanding to include all safety efforts. There was discussion on the appropriateness of using the ICC statute as the mechanism for the Executive Leadership Group. Vicki will provide Pam Langve-Davis a copy of statute to review. Billy Reamer stated that there was a contact listing for tribal health departments, which Pam requested a copy or link. Sgt. Greg Amundsen noted that Evan Rosenberg or other MPO representatives may be interested. The discussion of identifying the appropriate organization leaders included:

Those who would have a strong overlap would work as the DUI Task Force Leadership Team who would prioritize the Impaired Driving Crashes Emphasis Area strategies.

In closing participants were tasked to review strategies and discuss within their individual agencies the Executive Leadership role and responsibilities and who would be the appropriate leadership contact for the Executive Leadership Team that provides oversight to three CHSP Emphasis Area Teams. The
