What You Need...


- NOAA Weather Radio
- Flashlight
- Extra Batteries
- First aid kit
- Blankets
- Season-appropriate clothing
- Whistle to signal for help
- Dust mask
- Moist towelettes, garbage bags & plastic ties
- Basic Tool Kit, Knife & Shovel
- Axe or Saw
- Tow Chain, Straps or Come-Along
- Spare Tire
- Wire & Rope
- Starter Fluid, Extra Oil, & De-Icer
- Flares
- Kitty Litter or Sand
- Booster Cables
- Water
- Non-perishable, high energy food
- Local maps

Additional Items to Consider:

- Prescription medications & glasses
- Infant formula & diapers
- Pet food & extra water for your pet

- Important family documents (copies of insurance policies, identification and bank account records in a waterproof container)
- Cash or traveler's checks & change
- Fire Extinguisher
- Matches in a waterproof container
- Feminine supplies & personal hygiene items
- Mess kits, paper cups, plates & plastic utensils, paper towels
- Paper and pencil
- Books, games, puzzles or other activities for children
- Specialized items for disabled family member(s).
