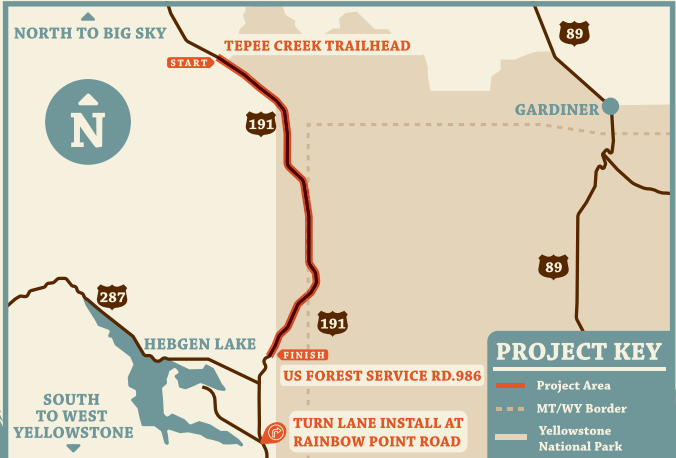




# HIGHWAY 191

NORTH OF WEST YELLOWSTONE

**U.S. Highway 191 between Big Sky and West Yellowstone is deteriorating.** The asphalt needs to be repaired. Luckily, the Montana Department of Transportation (MDT) and Riverside Contracting are repaving and improving safety in this corridor in 2020.



## WHAT EXACTLY DOES THIS WORK ENTAIL?

- Repaving Highway 191 from Tepee Creek Trailhead to U.S. Forest Service Road 986, between Big Sky and West Yellowstone.
- Creating a northbound left-turn-lane at Rainbow Point Road.
- Repairing bridge crossings over the Gallatin River and Specimen Creek.
- Replacing old guardrail with new rail.
- Adding rumble strips.

# DESIGN YOUR PLANS AROUND CONSTRUCTION.

## HERE ARE THE TOP THREE THINGS TO CONSIDER:

1.

**Plan extra time**, especially if you need to make your flight at the airport. U.S. Highway 191 is a two-lane highway that can get backed up during rush hour, particularly between Big Sky and Bozeman. Montana experiences long winters with limited months to perform construction, so you will likely experience multiple construction projects this summer.

2.

**Consider travel around peak construction.** This work is scheduled **Monday – Friday, 7 a.m. – 7 p.m., between May and October 2020.** The best way to stay in the know about closures is to sign up for the weekly update (see information on front of this card).

3.

**Stay patient.** We know you would rather be enjoying a beautiful drive through our mountainous roadways, not navigating orange cones. It is our goal to keep your drives safe so you can enjoy these roads for years to come. When traveling through construction, stay patient and reduce your speed. We will make every effort to limit construction areas and wait times to ensure your drives remain safe and pleasant.
