Come learn about the Montana Department of Transportation's and the city of Miles City's plans to improve Montana Highway 59 (MT 59) / North 7th Street in 2024.



# PROJECT OVERVIEW

-  The Montana Department of Transportation (MDT) has partnered with Diamond J Construction to make improvements along Montana Highway 59 (MT 59) / North 7th Street. Construction will begin at the intersection of MT 59 with Main Street and will continue north for approximately two miles, ending just past Secondary Highway 489 (S 489), also known as Kinsey Road.
-  In addition to the roadway improvements, the city of Miles City will be updating the water main, sewer line, and storm drain on the segment of roadway south of the Yellowstone River. This work will be completed in conjunction with MDT's roadway improvements to minimize the impacts to the public.



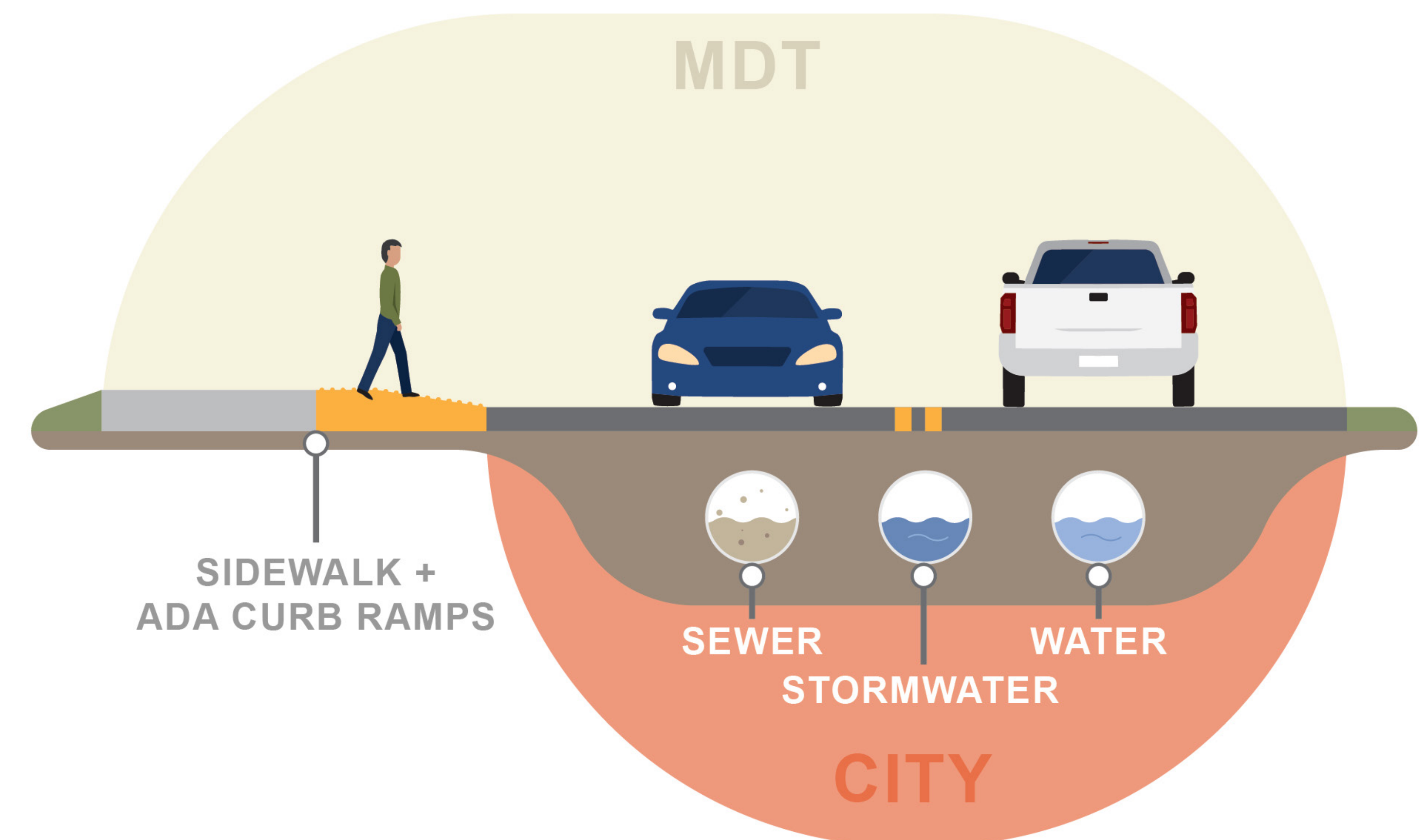

# PROJECT IMPROVEMENTS

## SOUTH OF THE YELLOWSTONE RIVER BRIDGE:

- Reconstruction of the roadway.
- Replacement of non-compliant Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) ramps and upgrades.
- Select upgrades to existing sidewalk and ADA curb ramps.
- City utility improvements to the water main, sewer line, and stormwater management system.
- New pavement markings, signage, and guardrail.

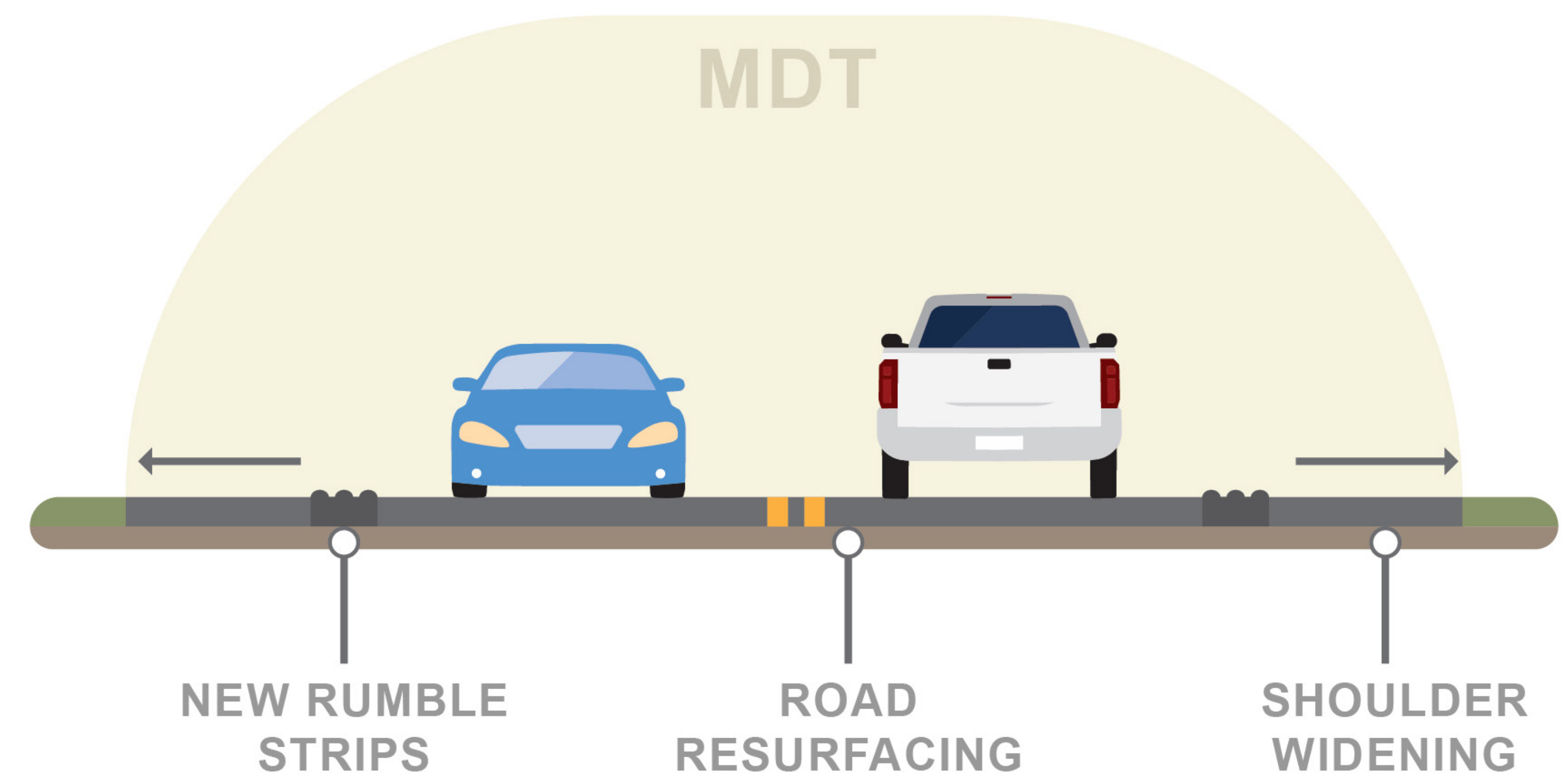










# PROJECT IMPROVEMENTS

## NORTH OF THE YELLOWSTONE RIVER BRIDGE:

- New roadway surface.
- Wider shoulders.
- New rumble strips.
- New pavement markings, signage, and guardrail.
- New stormwater drainage structures.



# PROJECT BENEFITS

-  Enhanced safety features.
-  Improved pedestrian and ADA access.
-  Minimized public impact by merging MDT's roadway and the City's water improvements into one project.
-  Increased reliability of underground water systems.
-  Better roadway drainage on the north end of the project.
-  Reduced maintenance costs.

# FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS



## What is the timeline for this project?

Construction is scheduled to begin in early April and is expected to continue through the fall of 2024. Diamond J Construction and MDT anticipate this project being completed in one construction season, weather and other unforeseen circumstances permitting.



## How is this project being funded?

Funding for this project is through the Surface Transportation Block Grant Program, administered by the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), which provides funding to states and localities for transportation improvement projects. The City of Miles City has received funds from the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) to help fund the water, sewer, and stormwater system improvements.



## How will this project impact businesses and residents in the area?

With significant upgrades to the roadway, sidewalk, and underground utility systems, this project will require some temporary closures and other traffic control. Business access will be maintained throughout construction although there will be times when access is temporarily limited. The project team recognizes the impact construction may have on businesses and area residents and is coordinating with them to minimize those impacts.
