Organizational Changes at MDT Aeronautics Program

After a detailed review of operational needs and alignment within the department, the Aeronautics Division will transition to the Aeronautics Program. This change reflects MDT's ongoing efforts to ensure consistency and clarity across all organizational units.

This transition is important because it:

- Aligns our organizational structure with the scale and function of Aeronautics work.
- Maintains and protects the delivery of services that aviation users rely on.
- Creates flexibility to support future growth and evolving needs.
- Enhances operational efficiency across program areas.

Under the new structure, the Aeronautics Program Manager will oversee three sections:

- Safety, Education & Registration Section.
- Airports, Airways & Grants Section.
- Yellowstone Airport Proprietary Program Section.

Each section reports directly to the Aeronautics Program Manager, creating a clearer and more streamlined reporting structure. This alignment is intended to strengthen coordination, reinforce program oversight, and support the continued delivery of high quality services to the aviation community and the public.

It is important to note that there will be no changes to services provided and offered by MDT Aeronautics.



Connecting a Big Sky State

Aviation has always punched above its weight in Montana, but new data from the 2026 MDT Aeronautics Economic Impact Study of 75 of 125 of Montana's Airports shows just how central it has become to life and business under the Big Sky. An estimated \$6.5 billion in total economic output and more than 39,000 jobs, reach into every corner of the state.

That impact is easy to feel on the ground. At one end of the system, commercial service hubs like Bozeman are handling record traffic as visitors and residents move through the state in greater numbers than ever before. Bozeman alone is projected to serve about 2.9 million passengers in 2026 and generates roughly \$2.2 billion in annual economic activity, accounting for about one third of all aviation jobs and output statewide. At the other end, small community and backcountry airstrips quietly enable wildfire response, search and rescue, medical transport, flight training, recreation, and access to communities that may be hours from the nearest interstate.

The numbers only tell part of the story. Aviation is how a rancher in eastern Montana gets to a specialist in Billings in a single morning, how tourists reach Glacier and Yellowstone for their first look at Montana's mountains, and how firefighters, mechanics, line service techs, and air traffic professionals build careers without leaving their home state. As we head into another busy summer season, every takeoff from the heaviest airliner to the lightest ultralight taildragger is a reminder that Montana's airports aren't just pieces of infrastructure; they are the front doors to our communities and a vital network that keeps this wide open state connected.

Attention Airport Sponsors

As a friendly reminder, airport sponsors who were previously awarded a loan or grant from MDT Aeronautics are required to complete a status update or project closeout form each year. To be eligible to apply for additional funding in the future, the closeout form or status update must be completed first.

The loan and grant application period opens on July 1 and will close on November 15, 2026.

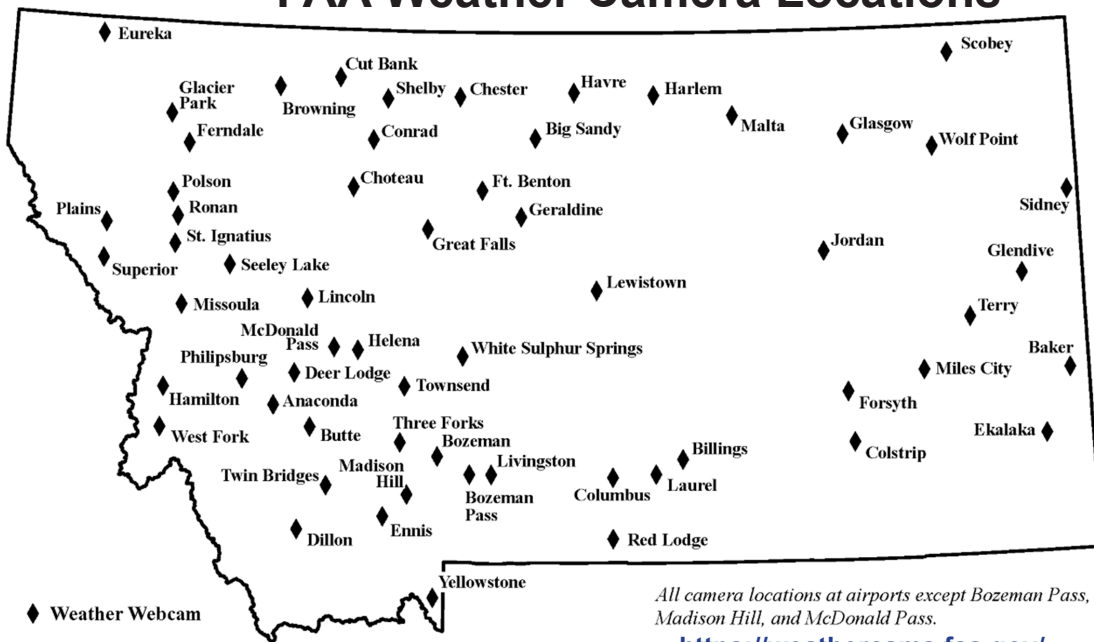
