When entering the intersection please:

- ⬅ Slow down
- ⬅ Yield to oncoming traffic and pedestrians
- ⬅ Turn left when it's safe

Left-turn crashes are often the most severe crashes at intersections.

Flashing yellow arrow signals keep traffic flowing smoothly and lead to fewer crashes. The signal directs motorists to turn left when there's a safe gap in traffic. A FLASHING YELLOW LEFT-TURN ARROW MEANS:

- < **SLOW DOWN**
- < **YIELD** to oncoming traffic and pedestrians
- < **TURN LEFT** when it's safe
