# Meeting purpose: Discuss the recommendations of the Impaired Driving Assessment and the States response to the recommendations to be rolled into workplan.

**Legislative Updates**- Chair Kevin Dusko provided an overview of legislative bills related to impaired driving and included whether the bills strengthen efforts to reduce impaired driving or are a threat to preventing impaired driving fatalities and serious injuries.

Bill Number: SB13

Title: Revise DUI laws related to admissible tests for presence of drugs

Legislative Intent: An act providing additional types of bodily fluids to test for the presence of drugs in driving while under the influence cases.

Current Status: Passed Senate, sent to House Judiciary

• Strengthens efforts in reducing impaired driving related fatalities & serious injuries.

Bill Number: HB92

Title: Revise laws related to addiction counselor assessments in DUI cases

Legislative Intent: An act allowing the department of justice to accept a licensed addiction counselor's assessment in determining whether to restore driving privileges for individuals convicted of an offense involving driving under the influence.

Current Status: Returned from enrolling.

• Mainly a clean up Legislation seen as positive.

# Bill Number: SB107

Title: Revise laws relating to civil liability for injuries related to alcohol

Legislative Intent: An act revising laws relating to civil liability for injuries involving alcohol overconsumption; providing that statutory law precludes a claim under any other theory of recovery or common law claim for injury or damages involving the alcohol consumer; clarifying laws related to the serving of alcohol consumers; providing considerations required of a jury or trier of fact; prohibiting certain considerations by a jury or trier of fact; revising who may bring a civil action; revising notice requirements; revising punitive damage. Current Status: Passed Senate, hearing in House Labor, pending executive action.

Watching this Legislation and still waiting for outcome

# Bill Number: HB279

# Title: Revise alcohol laws relating to server training.

Legislative Intent: An act revising laws related to responsible server and sales training programs concerning alcohol; requiring two training programs related to whether the server is employed at a licensed location where on-premises consumption of alcohol is allowed; requiring that a program for employees of licensees only providing off-premises consumption must take less time; specifying the minimum requirements for the training programs; and amending section 16-4-1006, mca."

Current Status: Passed House, transmitted to Senate.

• Unknown of exact impact to reducing impaired driving efforts.

# Bill Number: HB437

Title: Revise Drug laws

Legislative Intent: An act generally revising criminal drug laws; removing items related to testing drugs from the list of paraphernalia; removing the limitation on the type of tetrahydrocannabinols that must be present to constitute driving under the influence; amending sections 45-10-103 and 61-8-1002, mca; and providing an immediate effective date."

Current Status: Passed House, transmitted to the Senate.

• Strengthen laws regarding reducing impaired driving MV fatalities & serious injuries.

# Bill Number: HB681

Title: Revise laws related to sample collection to test for driver intoxication

Legislative Intent: An act revising laws related to the collection of breath ,blood, urine, and other bodily fluid samples from a person suspected of driving under the influence; requiring that the sample be collected without unreasonable delay after establishing particularized suspicion or probable cause, or obtaining a search warrant; allowing a peace officer to request a search warrant for a blood sample if the peace officer has probable cause that a person was under the influence of drugs, alcohol, or both and was involved in an accident or collision that resulted in serious bodily injury or death; allowing a peace officer to use reasonable force to obtain a sample when a search warrant is issued for the sample; and amending section 61-8-1016, mca."

Current Status: Passed House, transmitted to the Senate.

## Bill Number: HB704

Title: Revise laws related to expungement of a dui

Legislative Intent: An act revising laws related to expungement of driving under influence offenses; providing that expungement is presumed when the vehicle that the person was inside did not move; and amending sections 46-18-1107 and 6 46-18-1108, mca."

Current Status: Passed House, transmitted to the Senate.

 Weakens DUI laws and efforts to reduce impaired driving & related MV fatalities & serious injuries. There were bills that were tabled including one defining physical control of a motor vehicle in relation to a DUI, changing legal drinking age, & 1<sup>st</sup> time DUI. It was noted by the Traffic Safety Resource Prosecutor that it was apparent that there was a need to educate legislators and risks associated with being in actual physical control of a vehicle while impaired.

CHSP manager Pam Langve-Davis asked the questions to the group knowing there may be a likelihood to see these types of bills again in two years - <u>What can be done to educate decision makers</u> in advance of the next session?

## Discussion of Assessment Recommendations and draft State Responses-

Kevin provided an overview and shared screen of the document that was sent out to the group in advance. Kevin has been working with individuals to gather their input on the response document and rolling into the workplan for Executive leadership Team (ELT) approval.

Pam encouraged attendees to carefully review any safety efforts that may be associated with agencies and organizations; and if there are any concerns to please bring to Kevin's attention.

## **Strategy Updates**

## Strategy 1 - Deterrence and Enforcement-

MHP Capt Doug Samuelson reported on DRE scenario raining in Stillwater & Carbon counties. ARIDE courses are being planned as is Advanced Trial Court training. 2023 DRE classes are being scheduled. He is planning to attend a green lab training in Colorado.

• Kevin will touch base with Spencer Harris for the other Strategy 1 efforts.

## Strategy 2- Prevention and Education

Kimberly Koch reported that the Prevention Academy is planned for Aug 1 & 2 at Fairmont. Currently, developing sessions and lining up speakers. A topic of interest is prevention of underaged youth use of marijuana. A potential topic of focus to address is alcohol use and abuse at the collegiate level. Steve Schmidt shared the Think Twice www.duiprevention.org has a couple college focused programs.

Following the meeting Kim shared the Behavioral Health in Montana 2022 report that was sent out to the group. A link will be provided when it is posted.

Alyssa Johnson shared that the Trauma WebX is well received and is working on grant funded by SHTSS. Currently, working on trauma designation criteria for verification for Trauma I hospital. Annual reports and several epidemiology reports and fact sheets relevant to the CHSP Emphasis Area have been developed by Hannah Yang have been posted.

Kent Haab, ABCD reports that responsible alcohol sales and service (RASS) training has been provided to Dillon and Livingston Police Departments. A new curriculum is being rolled out for RASS training.

Steve Schmidt shared he has been / will be involved in various educational opportunities, including speaking at upcoming Montane Traffic Education Conference (MTEA) and the Lifesavers Conference among others. Dwight Nelson, Traffic Education Director, OPI shared he is working on the MT D.R.I.V.E. CDL program, which came about due to the shortage of school bus drivers.

#### Strategy 3- Criminal Justice System

Judge Knisley reported that CAMO & STEER continues with implementation an active in training other Treatment Courts in the Country. STEER has again been recognized as an Academy court . There is a scheduled Operation Tune-Up Training in May where 7 Treatment Court will be attending . Judge Knisley extended invitation to team members to attend the STEER Court. STEER meets every Wednesday of the week. There are 91 participants in the month of April. Currently working to finish National Center of DWI Courts Research. There has been some staff turnover. John Ryan is the new prosecutor. Referrals remain consistent. About 20% have cannabis on board with alcohol . Recidivism is still low at < 10%. Teleservice track is funded for 7 years by MDT. There is a tribal connection with federal courts to serve tribal members.

Ed Hirsch, TSRP put the call out to let prosecutors and law enforcement that DUI Prosecution training is available. Trainings are scheduled through June.

Kevin shared that the Crime Labs annual report will be out soon.

Tanner Van Wyck, CCD educational specialist with DOR reported that they have developed and continue to work on education and promote responsibility and proper storage of adult use recreational marijuana products.

#### **Strategy 4 - Communication Program**

Janet Kenny, SHTS supervisor relayed that MDT is recommitted to promote positive messaging and are in the formative stages of media campaign to be rolled out this summer. Enhanced focus on distracted driving and speeding will be promoted with additional of other funding made available for safety messaging.

#### Strategy 6- Program Evaluation and Data

Kevin will be having a focused data discussion and topic will be a focus of the April meeting. There is a Criminal Justice data legislation (SB 11), which will have an impact on the Montana Board of Crime Control if passed. Brooklyn Johns- Blassic reported that the 2021 date files including impaired driving has been submitted to FARS/NHTSA.
